D. Sawale**, Head Department of History is working as Chairman of BOS for history.
- ✓ Semester pattern was implemented by Dr. B. A. M. U. Aurangabad for all the faculties. It includes 30-20 pattern for third year and 50 marks term end examination only for the first and second year.
- ✓ Semester examination of 30 marks was conducted and 20 marks were reserved for internal test and tutorial for third year.

- ✓ The institution tries to complete the university syllabus within the time limit. We prepare a teaching plan and supervise it.
